ADA Primary School

ADA Primary is a Way of Living, Exploring and Learning. Nestled inside a green park outside Baku, our school helps our children escape hustle and bustle of a large city, live in contact with nature and explore their true self in a stimulating environment designed for active learning.

Our primary program provides opportunities to develop confidence, self-reliance, creativity, expression, imagination, and most importantly, desire to learn and to grow in a safe, trusting, rewarding, and nurturing environment. Our students fall in love with their school, while also respect and admire their teachers.

Students enroll at ADA Primary at the age of 6 and study through the age of 10.

Our primary program is part of the ADA School Pathway, where the three stages lead seamlessly from early years to secondary and pre-university years.

We are launching ADA Primary in September 2024. This summer, we will intake an inaugural class of 60 students. Some 20 students will enroll in Grades 1, 2 and 3 respectively. ADA Primary will admit full capacity of students as of 2025.

ADA Secondary will be launched as of September 2026.

Meanwhile, we will reform ADA High School into ADA College before September 2025. Students will study for 3 years at ADA College. Successful graduates will enroll in ADA University and study for 3 years in our undergraduate programs.



Five Pillars of Our Primary Education

Our primary education is built on Five Pillars conveying dreams and aspirations of young students. These youngsters seek a balanced education. They want to know the world, but also find their own place in that world. They come to school because it is a trusting and rewarding place for them. Core Values

Competencies

Our students take their educational journey through ADA Primary to acquire the following competencies known as the "Five C's".

Critical Thinking

The knowledge of content is important, but equally important it is to learn that content in real world context and apply that knowledge to real world issues. Our program helps students to develop curiosity. We spark their imagination. We help them to question things. They recognize there is a problem. They know when something is wrong or likely to go wrong. They combine pieces of information, make general rules, produce answers that make sense.

Creativity

We teach our students to come up with unusual or clever ideas about a given situation. They develop original ways to solve a problem. They learn to become reflective, confident, and independent.

Communication

Our students express themselves clearly and creatively; give full attention to what other people are saying, take time to understand the points being made, ask questions as appropriate, not interrupting at inappropriate times and participate in class discussions. They develop skills for reading, fall in love with books and write clearly. They learn to express a meaning and connect with peers and audience.


Collaboration

Curriculum

ADA Primary is a bilingual program. Azerbaijani is our primary language of instruction, while students learn English as a Second Language.

We have 10 subjects of study.

We have considered US and European models as a base, on which we are developing our own curriculum.

Since inception, we have built a flagship university in Azerbaijan whose language of instruction is English. By doing so, we have opened up minds of our students to the outside world, a world which is bigger than their own self. While living through our own success in higher education, we have also drawn lessons from challenges of the secondary education in Azerbaijan.

We believe a quality education is not just a domain of instruction in foreign languages. Top quality education can be built in our own language of Azerbaijani as well. Now, we want to build that.

We will build a school where Azerbaijani is the primary language of instruction. A child walking into our school will learn how to write, read and speak in own language first. Students will learn English as their second language.

Azerbaijani Studies is a core of our education in ADA School. It is an interdisciplinary way of teaching language, literature, history, geography, fine arts, music, theater, cinema, carpets, architecture, cuisine, and materials culture of Azerbaijan. All these will be taught around our own values and traditions. Our educational journey at ADA Primary cultivates our identity boosted by our sense of citizenship.

A Day at Primary

Students start arriving in school as of 8.15 am. Our day starts with a breakfast served between 8.15 am and 8.45 am. Sharing a meal together is a school philosophy. Even if a student eats breakfast at home, they are asked to share a table and some meal with their friends before our day starts. Classes start at 8.45 am. Morning sessions focus on core subjects. Each class runs for 40 minutes, followed by a 5-minute break. Core classes are taught in morning sessions. Lunch is served between 12.45 and 1.15 pm. Students will also have 2 snacks per day: the first one around 11 am. the second one around 3.00 pm. Afternoon sessions focus on studio and maker-learning, reading and extended learning, physical education and well-being of students.

A variety of studios focus on Art, Design, Music and Drama. Here, the students engage in creative activities, while also learning about art, design, music, theater, cinema and other parts of Azerbaijan's culture. While they have afternoon snack, students spend time playing outside. Playtime is followed by Library and Extended Learning hour, where students read books and complete their tasks due for the next day. The Extended Learning will be followed by Physical Education and Wellbeing hours. Once a week, students will also engage in their Social Responsibility project. Students will be dismissed just before 5.00 pm.



ADA Primary is nestled inside a green park outside Baku. Situated steps away from Gala, our new campus has a convenient access to Heydar Aliyev Avenue, while also being at the edge of Mardakan, Shuvelan and surroundings.

ADA Gardens in Gala contain an artificial lake and a stretch of land lined with trees, flowers and bushes, also surrounded by vast plantations of olive and almond trees. In this magical setting of nature, students will create their own fairy tales, explore every single boundary and learn while exploring.

Science and Nature. We will create a nurturing environment for our young children to explore themselves in harmony with nature and to grow with awareness of it. The campus will have its own farm, where our young farms will grow their own vegetables and greens, while also enjoying the company of farm animals. In our cafeteria, we will eat what we will grow. Classes will spill outside Science Lab, where our

young scientists will learn about plants, animals, soil, water, earth and universe, while being in direct touch with them.

Arts and Culture. Statues will be placed along the avenues around the park. Art will be on display at Galleria ADA. The campus will contain a replica of Shakespeare's Globe Theater. Throughout the park, we will design and build a stimulating environment for our Creative Explorers.

Mind and Body. We believe what we put in our mouth is what makes our Body, and what we put in our head is what makes our Mind. Harmony of mind and body will be enhanced through our physical education and wellbeing program. Students will enjoy athletic facilities with outside playgrounds, football, basketball and other fields.

We take learning outside classroom and make sure it continues everywhere throughout the campus.

ADA Primary charges a flat fee of 15,000 AZN. Of this fee, some 12,500 AZN is a tuition, while some 2,500 AZN is for food and beverage.
